

Dear Riviera Family,

Missional Churches are vibrant churches. The Mission Committee, under the leadership of Elders Barbara Overton and Vivian German, has worked hard this past year so that we regain our sense of identity.... our mission.... and involve the whole congregation in it. Ask long time Riviera members what the church means to them and they will inevitably talk with pride

about our history of working in issues of justice and racial equality. It is a part of the DNA of our church. Since the 1960's when Sam Houck was the minister here, the congregation has felt called to speak on behalf of school desegregation and equality in education and the church has not been afraid to take Christ's message of love outside our sanctuary walls. During Flash Gordon's era the Child Care Center was built by members of Riviera to answer the need for good child care for working mothers and this same call the members felt to social justice issues continued when Norman Stanton was pastor. During the era that Rick Neale and Laurie Kraus were your pastors, Riviera folk moved further in their call to be inclusive and the church modeled God's unconditional love by being at the forefront of the More Light Movement. The Riviera Congregation consciously welcomed the GLBTQ community into full membership, leadership, and fellowship. Riviera is what it is because of the saints that came before us and each member's ministries help define our corporate identity.

Today we are proud to be a More Light Church and of our continued commitment to the inclusivity of all God's children. We are proud of our ministries to feed the hungry and to be named a Presbyterian Hunger Action Congregation. We continue our commitment to education through the Child Care Center and our partnership with Francis Tucker Elementary School. And we are proud to be an Earth Care Congregation since 2013. We have made a commitment to be a sanctuary church concerned for the rights of the immigrants among us and also a church who prays for peace and who is an advocate in ways to end gun violence. These ministries are what make our church alive and make the Gospel relevant to our world. These ministries are where God is calling Riviera.

And this year, the Mission Committee is feeling the call to what might be the most important mission of our day. Located in what might be 'ground zero' in the climate change of our country, we will work to educate ourselves and others and take action in ways we can be good stewards of God's environment. Our faith calls us to respond to this global crisis we are facing. As a people who believe in the God of Creation, it is a mandate of our faith. I can feel the Spirit moving us forward.

God has called us in the past and continues to call us, dear Riviera family, to be a witness to the world. And, once again, Riviera will answer as you always have using the phrase from Isaiah, "Here I am, Send Me!" (Isaiah 6:8)




Visitors and church members (of any age) are welcome and encouraged to join Theology Over Morning Java on Sunday mornings, at 9:30am in the church library.

THEOLOGY UNCORKED


Theology Uncorked will meet on Sunday, October 13th at 5:00 pm at Titanic Restaurant and Brewery, where we wrestle with issues of social concern.

Discipleship News...



Welcome to the 2019–2020 Presbyterian Women/Horizons Bible study, Love Carved in Stone: A Fresh Look at the Ten Commandments. What would it mean to consider the Ten Commandments not as a harsh list of what not to do but, instead, as a "love letter" from a loving God? A fresh embrace of the Ten Commandments (or Words), author Eugenia Gamble suggests, may ultimately contribute to the restoration of ourselves and our communities and the furthering of the gospel in the world. "Moral behavior matters, not simply because immoral actions can anger or disappoint God, but because principled behavior is how love becomes real, both toward God and in community." Love Carved in Stone is a Bible study that helps us reframe the way we look at and live in the world.

Why the Ten Words? The author notes that nowhere in the Hebrew text does the word for "commandment" appear. She says, "In the Bible, these utterances are called just what they are: 'words.' I've chosen to use the term 'Ten Words' because it is the biblical form and opens us up to looking at the Ten Commandments in fresh ways."

Each lesson begins with an exploration of one of the Ten Words in its biblical context. From there we consider a moment from Jesus' life that shows us how he lived out that Word. We then consider the Word for our own lives and contexts.

During the September Session meeting the elders rejoiced about the addition of the Rev. Rosemary Noga Welton and the Rev. Dr. David P. Welton as Parish Associates for Visitation. Session also approved continuing serving Communion the first Sunday of the month and during Maundy Thursday/Seder service. The curriculum Deep Blue Kids for children and the women's study Love Carved in Stone were also approved. Session voted to become a Matthew 25 congregation and noted that the Presbytery of Tropical Florida agreed to join the Miami Climate Alliance. Grant application is being submitted to the Presbytery of Tropical Florida for a new sound system.
