How are you involved in the RPC Music Ministry Program? choir, tambourinist, Letter Fairy

How long have you served? 25 years

What brought you to RPC? An old boyfriend. They got rid of him and kept me.

What do you feel makes RPC as special place to be? Because everyone is respected as an individual no matter what their beliefs.

What are your thoughts on how music impacts, transforms, or is essential to... worship? (life!?) Since I am Jewish, I was raised singing half of any worship service. It brings people together, gives them a sense of belonging since we all sing the same music together. Anthems help people center themselves for the sermons.

If you are so inclined, please briefly share something unique about you or share an interesting experience or story relating to your creation of music? I was not allowed to sing until I was in my 40's. Laurie, our former pastor, and Warren, our former director of music, asked me to join the choir and when I told them I couldn't sing, Warren said he would teach me, and he did.

What would you want to say to someone reading this who may be considering becoming part of the RPC music program? It doesn't matter if you think you have any musical talent, you can always learn enough to contribute to the "sound of music". It gives one a good feeling to know that you were able to contribute to the worship service.

Anything else you would like to share?...

Choir has evolved over the last 25 years. We no longer just get together on Sunday to practice and join the service. There is a camaraderie among the choir members as we meet, kibitz, eat and drink together and sing together on rehearsal evenings. We have a choir director who has proven his ability to get a beautiful sound out of a very diverse group and make it fun. That's the operative word - **choir is fun.**

75th Anniversary Art Installation - February 7, 2020

As the 75th anniversary of Riviera approached I began to think of ways that we should celebrate the church birthdate that reflects who we are. We are an artistic and expressive community and I knew that music and art should in some way be a part of our anniversary celebration.

In the last century when churches had anniversaries they would often have sets of plates made to celebrate the occasion. It is fitting theologically as we celebrate a meal as one of our sacraments together. So, having church plates made not only celebrates our communion with each other but our fellowship and community we have when we share meals together.

In some of the older churches I have served, they had several sets of plates from previous anniversaries. Riviera had a set made on their 10th anniversary and one of the plates can be seen in the narthex of the church in a cabinet.

But having a set of plates made for our anniversary just did not seem to be us at this time.... but using the idea of plates in an art installation excited me. What if the plates could be designed and painted and were ready for every family in the church to personalize theirs in some way? Our congregation is made up of such individuals that it seemed even more appropriate to make each plate unique even before the members personalized theirs.

The art installation is made of 50 plates. They are each unique but are a definitely a set of plates in that the patterns are similar and the same 6 colors are used. The colors are those in our chancel cross made by Kathy Stults. Each plate represents a family and/or mission of the church. They are installed in the sanctuary in the pattern of our Celtic cross representing that we are a reflection of the unconditional love the cross represents.




The Deep Blue Mission:




THEOLOGY UNCORKED

JOB DESCRIPTION

POSITION: Youth Education and Outreach Assistant REPORTS TO: Minister, Riviera Presbyterian Church Full Year, Part Time, Salaried Position

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The objective for the Youth Education and Outreach Assistant will be to serve, lead, teach, mentor, and motivate the children and youth of Riviera Presbyterian Church in their walk with God and support our Child Care Center mission. They will work closely with the Minister, staff and Discipleship and Worship Committees and is responsible for the implementation and development of ministries for the spiritual formation of children, youth and parents. The Youth Education and Outreach Assistant will be given well-rounded, practical experience in all areas of Children/Youth and College Ministry and will function as a program staff member of Riviera Presbyterian Church. This part time, salaried position is 20-25 hours per week for the full year. Final candidates will be subject to a background check.

QUALIFICATIONS

The Children/Youth Education and Outreach Assistant should not only see themselves as a spiritual mentor for children, youth and congregants, but as a living example of Christian life. The Children/Youth Education and Outreach Assistant will always be expected to demonstrate the highest level of integrity at all times. Ideally, the person will be Presbyterian and be able to articulate Reformed Theology.

This leader must be:

- 1. 'The face of the children's and youth ministry' for Riviera Presbyterian Church and will work closely with the Minister and other Committee leaders in aligning the Children and Youth Ministry and our Child Care Center mission with the overall vision for the church.
- 2. A creative, talented and hard-working team player.
- 3. Must be knowledgeable in curriculum resources for our denomination.

LEADERSHIP COMPETENCIES

- 1. Excellent leadership, organizational and communication skills.
- 2. Exceptional planning skills, commitment and a sense of caring.
- 3. Good team player with a willingness to collaborate with all staff members, committee members and volunteers to develop common interests and educational ministry opportunities.
- 4. Sensitivity to and appreciation of the unique needs of the religious community.
- 5. Works toward the overall vision of Riviera Presbyterian Church.

This key leader should also:

- 1. Have a positive attitude.
- 2. Be a self-starter who works well independently with ability to take direction from and listen to supervisor.
- 3. Demonstrate a willingness to delegate to team members and volunteers, as required.
- 4. Work well in large and small group settings, particularly with children, youth and parents.
- 5. Exhibit an ability to recruit, train, and equip volunteers.
- 6. Demonstrate flexibility and problem-solving skills
- 7. Demonstrate discernment and wise judgment.

- 8. Carefully maintain discretion and effectively deals with sensitive and/or confidential information of a written and spoken nature.
- 9. Add value to assigned tasks and meetings attended.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Build a children and youth curriculum and teach on those Sunday mornings with volunteers.
- 2. Develop a children and youth summer program for Riviera Presbyterian Church.
- 3. Develop the Youth curriculum to impact the hearts of our children and partner with parents.
- 4. Plans, organizes, recruits and trains volunteers for participation in special church events throughout the year.
- 5. Helps and encourages new families to participate in the children's ministry and connect groups.
- 6. Participates and includes the children and youth in all other events planned by Riviera Presbyterian Church.
- 7. Recruits, trains and equips volunteer leaders who serve in Children/Youth's Ministry.
- 8. Recruits and trains volunteers for the Sunday children's sermon. Maintains this schedule and fills in to do the children's sermon as necessary.
- 9. Manages the scheduling of those volunteers and has the ability to lead volunteer teams.
- 10. Attends weekly worship and all children/youth group ministry activities.
- 11. Organize, prepare, and execute both formal and informal activities designed to help our children and parents grow in their faith.
- 12. Coordinate and execute regular communication about children/youth events to students and families.
- 13. Be a liaison to the Child Care Center (CCC). Explains appropriate church activities to CCC children and families and invites them to participate.
- 14. Reads to CCC children as part of 'Story Time' as needed.
- 15. Attend weekly staff meetings and monthly meetings of the Discipleship Committee.
- 16. Maintain a regular work week that includes office hours, but which focuses on spending as much time as possible in forming relationships with children, youth and parents.
- 17. Prepare an annual written statement of long-term and short-term goals and an evaluation of the prior year's goals.
- 18. Demonstrates a Christ-like attitude in the work of the church and beyond.
- 19. Uses independent judgment to determine work priorities.
- 20. Other responsibilities as outlined by the Minister of Riviera Presbyterian Church.

ACCOUNTABILITY

The Youth Education and Outreach Assistant reports to the Minister/Head of Staff of Riviera Presbyterian Church. They shall be responsible to the Session through the Personnel Team.

EVALUATION

The Youth Education and Outreach Assistant shall be evaluated annually by the Minister/Head of Staff in consultation with the Personnel Committee and other Committees as applicable.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

One-three years' experience in Children's Ministry or related experience.
Bachelor's degree in related field (or at minimum be enrolled in college taking 9-12 credits per
semester and have completed their freshman year of college.)
