





### **How the CCC Became a Reality:**

In the late '70's, RPC minister, Howard Gordon, set up a committee to research how to use the educational building of the church that sat empty all week. I, and another member had just read an article in the Presbyterian Survey magazine about churches who had developed weekly preschool programs. That set off a yearlong study which determined that the kind of program RPC could develop would use the Educational building Monday through Friday from 7am to 7pm for a full day child care program for infant through preschool children of working parents.

The Session took on the endorsement and development of a non-religious, 7am to 7pm program as a mission. Within a year and a half The Child Care Center, Inc. became a reality.

The commitment to providing warm nurturing care for infants through young 5 year olds as well as a developmentally appropriate early childhood learning experience has been our focus for the past 40years. Over 2000 children have spent at least part of their preschool years in the care the Riviera community has provided through the stewardship of the education buildings. Think of it! That is a continuing and very significant fulfillment of a vision conceived by this congregation 40 years ago.
