
So my sarcasm screams to me, of course it will be an active hurricane season as well.



Riviera will be collecting the Pentecost Offering during the month of June.


The Pentecost Offering helps the church encourage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children.

As we work through the Book of Acts this summer, there are two opportunities that we, God's children of ALL ages, can make its message come to life for us.




