Dear Riviera Family,

Wow! We are a month into 2021 and God is at work!

No.... we are still in a pandemic and God's realm is not on earth, but there is so much for which we can be grateful

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday which falls on February 17th this year. On Ash Wednesday Christians are asked to take up a Lenten Discipline that they will commit to until Easter. Some people have traditionally 'given up something.' The idea is that you prepare for Easter by sacrificing something you enjoy. And for many this is a meaningful spiritual exercise. This year, where we have had to go without so many things that are enjoyable and meaningful to us, so I challenge you not to give up something for Lent, but to take on something instead.

On February 6th, those of you who are in the Miami area will be getting a delivery from the church. (People living outside of Miami will have the materials sent to you.) In the bag will be the bread for the communion service the next day and a package of soup which is our Souper Bowl Fundraiser for hunger and the supplies you will need for Lent.

And in the Lenten Supplies will be two things I hope you will use as you take on a Lenten Discipline.

*First - 'there is a little olive wood cross. This pocket cross is for you to take with you throughout the day as a reminder of your commitment to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. We, people of faith, look at the world through the lenses of the teachings of Jesus.... and our crosses will help us to see love where others see hate, to see commonality where others only see differences, and to see possibility and a call to make God's realm on earth where others only see the problems.

*Second - there is a journal. This is a gratitude journal where you are to write, draw, or list things for which you are grateful for each day during Lent. In study after study, psychologists have found that gratitude is strongly and consistently associated with greater happiness. It has even proven to change your brain! And for the person of faith who believes all things come from our Creator God, it is appropriate to address this gratitude to God.

I challenge you to join me in following these two disciplines for our Lenten Season. And I look forward to seeing what happens to each of us and our community as a whole when we do. I think it will be transformational!







Per Capita—The History

The origin story of Per Capita takes us back to the earliest Presbyterian General Assembly meetings in the U.S. In those days, the Assembly met annually, always in Philadelphia. As the church expanded into far-off places like Ohio, Kentucky and Missouri, attendance at the Assembly became prohibitively expensive to frontier commissioners.

So in 1806, the Assembly began development of a "Commissioner Travel Expense Fund," which over the years came to be known as Per Capita. Today nearly all the expense of a General Assembly is paid by Per Capita with nearly half of that paying for travel, housing and feeding of the 800-900 commissioners and advisory delegates who attend.

What is an Assembly? It is the one place where the whole church gathers. Commissioners and youth from every presbytery are in attendance. Representative students from the seminaries, ecumenical partners from all over the world, and mission co-workers make up a significant number of advisory delegates. Thousand more gather as observers or supporters.

They are there first of all to worship, and also to do business. An idea which may have begun at a local church's session meeting passes through presbyteries to become Assembly business as overtures. There are Moderators to elect and mission initiatives to form at Assemblies. It is also the place where the larger church can adopt statements which speak to the Church and sometimes to those outside the Church about issues of theology, justice and peacemaking.

At an Assembly everyone's voice is valued, every part of the Church is brought into the light of the Spirit and together the people seek to discern the will of Christ.

When you read stories of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance out in the field or pick up a new Glory to God hymnal, you are engaging in the work of an Assembly. When pastors are trained and ruling elders study the Book of Order, they are resourced by the work of an Assembly. When mission co-worker enters a new field or a Young Adult Volunteer holds the hand of a hungry child, they are continuing the work of an Assembly.

The 2021 Per Capita is \$37.00 per member. Each church is asked to pay this annual apportionment. If you would like to help us defray the cost we welcome your donation. You may donate online https://www.rivierachurch.org/give/ under Per Capita.

All Presbyterians are called to take part in the whole church's ecclesiastical and administrative work through per capita giving. The annual rate is a per-member apportionment that is assessed biennially by the General Assembly. (Book of Order, G-3.0106)
