> Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat.

22 churches raised \$5,700 in the first year. The number of groups involved has steadily grown each year, and so has the amount raised and put back into the communities. (From Wikipedia)

Henry Barrow, husband of Sandy Barrow, was a long time Riviera member who passed away February 26, 2020. Henry had a terrific career background which included being a member of the first broadcast team for the Miami Dolphins. In the 1990's, Henry became involved in Riviera's Youth Group, learned about the **Souper Bowl of Caring**, and created Riviera's version of this important event.

Henry led the youth in the planning to cook soups – usually chicken with vegetables and a vegan option – to serve to Riviera's congregation on Super Bowl Sunday. He and the youth purchased or got donated ingredients and on Saturday mornings, fueled by a box of donuts Henry brought in for the group, they started slicing and dicing ingredients and

Souper Bowl Sunday was always a fun day at Riviera. Members of the congregation brought salads, breads, and desserts to round out the soup lunch. After Worship service, we lined up in Fellowship Hall to be served soup by members of the Youth Group supervised by Henry. It was always interesting, fun, and delicious!

Following the spirit of the **Souper Bowl of Caring** organizational events which support food-related community charities, funds generated from Riviera's Souper Bowl events support our Food Pantry and the Presbyterian Hunger Program.

An Unexpected Journey: Walking the Labyrinth with Riviera Presbyterian Church By Laura Fothergill

I have walked on a labyrinth since 2003, not quite twenty years of putting one foot in front of the other, winding along a path filled with adventure, joy, grief, community, isolation and all the holiness of a life filled with God's spirit. Some time during 2003 I was asked to assist with re-painting and fixing a project started by then Parish Associate Rev. Sally Campbell-Evans. Families and individuals of Riviera had spent time painting sections of winding paths and borders on four large fabric canvases. The only issue was, they never worked together and the paths were different sizes, different widths, the four canvas puzzle pieces didn't fit together. Over weeks and months I carefully re-worked, re-painted, and put together each border, each path into a large room-size Cretan Labyrinth. This was my first introduction to the labyrinth.

Over time, the spiritual practice of walking the labyrinth became a part of the Riviera community during holy seasons of Lent and Advent as well as confirmation classes, retreats, grief work, and for spiritual formation with young adults. The original homemade canvas Cretan Labyrinth along with an additional purchased canvas Chartres Labyrinth are extremely special tools that are rooted in our community's spiritual and social justice values. A walk along a labyrinth can be used for many reasons and can provide healing, awareness, pray space, personal intention, and commitment amongst providing a powerful way to be together as a community, as a body of Christ, and as a loved child of God.

It is this time, a transitional time in Riviera's community, between Pastors, and during our Covid-19 pandemic that each of us have an opportunity for our own growth as well as for our community. I personally invite you to join me and Anna Rosas for an opportunity to take a moment to be together and to experience this special tool. Due to safety protocols we will take our first steps outdoors at a community labyrinth located in Pinecrest. All are welcome. The Mission Committee continues to be very active and busy during these challenging times. We continue to walk our walk as a Matthew 25 congregation:

Hunger issues: Both locally and globally, as evident with our ongoing commitment to the Food



Pantry that distributes family and single food bags of food and essentials bi-weekly. On average, we distribute 35 bags/month for families and 10-20 single bags. In addition, we recently created signage for the Food Pantry placed on Sunset Drive that will increase the awareness of this community Pantry and assist with spreading the word.

Ellen Anderson works endless hours managing the **Food Pantry**, handling shopping, stocking, and distribution. The community and RPC are incredibly fortunate to have Ellen's unwavering dedication and commitment to this cause.

Globally, the Mission Committee continues to support international and national organizations tackling global hunger. For example, Barbara Overton has connected with **Bread for the World**. Bread for the World is a non-partisan, Christian advocacy organization based in the United States that advocates for policy changes to end hunger. RPC hopes to host a workshop with Florence French from Bread for the World, discussing the difference between racial equity and racial equality. Be on the lookout for the date for this insightful workshop.



Voting Rights: The Mission Committee will make voting rights for all a priority over the next year by donating funds to local groups and volunteering and working with grassroots organizations to assure all people have access to voting.





Winn Dixie selected the RPC Food Pantry as their "Bloomin' 4Good" Program recipients. The South Miami Winn Dixie at 5850 SW 73rd Street will be the highlighted store in February. Don't forget to visit the Dragonfly Boutique and shop or donate. The Art Deco mirror I donated sold fast!




