LEAP FOR LADIES

LEAP empowers women who have experienced incarceration through transformational opportunities and advocacy. For every woman who has experienced incarceration and who is committed to change to have the opportunity and tools to achieve her full potential.

Riviera Presbyterian Church started its relationship with LEAP by providing groceries to help augment their needs. We next decided that providing grocery gift certificates every week to allow them to buy fresh produce, milk and bread was more practical.

The ladies work at Dragonfly Thrift Boutique (3141 SW 8th Street, Miami, Florida 33135) a wonderful place to shop! Recently they had a visit by Vice President Kamala Harris. The ladies were thrilled and honored to have her visit and shop.





Riviera Presbyterian church also assists the ladies by donating bicycles, their main mode of transportation. We are lucky to have members who have donated bicycles, and more are needed as they get new ladies in the houses and, unfortunately, they get stolen, even with locks.

One of the ladies, Cheyanne Guzy runs a car detailing service. On June 5th we had a car wash at Riviera and everyone who had their vehicle washed was very pleased. We are planning another car wash for Sunday, September 11th starting at 9:00 AM. A sign-up sheet will be available in the narthex.

When the new ladies are released, they are given a place in transition housing near the boutique. LEAP provides paid retail job training at Dragonfly Thrift Boutique. Training at the Dragonfly includes customer service, computer skills, photography, social media, inventory management and more.

When they come out of incarceration they need shoes, undergarments and other basic necessities. Riviera Presbyterian Church provides a \$50 Target gift certificate so that they may purchase these items.

We can continue our mission for LEAP for Ladies by donating to or shopping at the Dragonfly Thrift boutique, donating bicycles, phones or laptops, attending special events or even mentoring one of the ladies.

Prayer Lists: How to Protect Privacy

Obtain permission before sharing sensitive information

Sweeping changes to privacy laws have changed the way doctors, hospitals, and even insurance companies handle health care information. Part of the <u>Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act</u> (HIPAA) that took effect in 2003 made it illegal for health care providers to disclose information about a person's medical condition. Generally, the Act doesn't pertain to churches. However, the ensuing discussion of privacy rights has led many churches to reexamine how they share personal information through prayer ministries.

Here are some suggestions on how to maintain a prayer ministry without offending the prayer recipient or breaking the law.

There's nothing that prevents a person from telling the congregation—or the whole world—that he has a medical condition and would like prayer. But some laws prevent *you* from telling the world for him. Therefore, **it's a good idea to obtain a person's consent before disclosing personal information.** It could be as simple as asking someone: "Would you like us to add you to the prayer list?" or "Would you mind if we shared this information with the congregation?" It's easiest to get verbal consent, but you have far greater legal protection if you obtain it in writing.

Even with a person's consent, it's best to keep the information general. A notice that says "Sue Smith has been hospitalized, and we pray for a speedy recovery" is better than "Sue Smith has been suffering from debilitating panic attacks that have caused her to be admitted to the hospital. Please pray for her."

Some churches avoid the problem of **obtaining consent by printing information on how to reach a relative or close friend who has agreed to serve as spokesperson.** The spokesperson can decide how much detail to release, and to whom. That person is probably in a better position than the church to know how much information to share.

Churches should be extremely cautious about disclosing health-related information about their employees without their consent. In particular, churches can be held legally liable for disclosing such information about employees (or their dependents) obtained through the church's health plan. You should obtain the employee's consent to release the information. Even with permission, less is generally best.




