

#### **RPC Ministries**

- 1. Volunteers are needed for Monday and Wednesday mornings from 9:00 AM to 12:00 noon. Duties include getting signatures from clients, giving them a bag of food, and filling a replacement bag according to the list in the pantry.
- 2. Bags are needed for the individual bags. Drawstring backpacks or small reusable shopping bags work very well. 10" by 12" bags with handles we get from stores and restaurants are also good.
- 3. Please remember that we need donations for the food pantry. A one-pound bag of rice or pasta, 12-ounce bags of dried beans, and any non-expired canned goods are always welcome.
- 4. We are only halfway to our goal of 500 pairs of white men's socks for Socktober. Socks can be purchased at Amazon and shipped to the church. Dollar Tree has socks for \$1.25 for 2 pairs.
- 5. We are partners with Frances Tucker Elementary School on Douglas Road. Everyone is invited to go to the school to meet the students and teachers during our Mission visits. Currently, we are getting ready for gift distribution to the students from the first graders. It is heartwarming to see the looks on the faces of these young students. You may pick up an About Me sheet in the sanctuary, or you may \$20 and we will shop for you. Visit our website to donate www.rivierachurch.org/give.
- 6. We also partner with LEAP for Ladies. LEAP is dedicated to helping incarcerated women transcend their past. Riviera provides the ladies in the Transitional Housing with a food gift certificate every week to help them buy fresh produce, milk, and eggs. When a lady leaves the prison and joins the program, we give her a \$50 Target gift certificate to help her get the necessities to start her journey. They frequently need shoes, toiletries, and even reading glasses. We will also be giving the ladies in transitional housing Target gift certificates for Christmas.

We can also help by donating to and/or shopping at The Dragonfly Thrift Boutique at 3141 SW 8th Street. They also have an office in South Miami (5815 SW 68th Street) where we can drop off our donations of upscale items.
