Adapted from Thanksgiving Address: Greetings to the Natural World of the Haudenosaunee Nation

Leader: Today, we are gathered and called to live in balance and harmony with each other and all living things. So now, we bring our minds together as one as we give greetings and thanks to each other as people.

All: Let us give thanks for each other. Now our minds are one.

Kyle – East - Reader 1: We greet our Mother, the Earth, for she gives us all that we need for life. She supports our feet as we walk about upon her. She continues to care for us as she has from the beginning of time. To our mother, we give thanks.

## All: Let us give thanks for Mother Earth. Now our minds are one.

Butch – South - Reader 2: We send greetings and thanks to the Animal life of Creation. They have many things to teach us as people. We are honored by them when they give up their lives so we may use their bodies as food for our people. We are glad they are still here and we hope that it will always be so.

# All: Let us give thanks for our fellow creatures. Now our minds are one.

Kathy – West - Reader 3: We give thanks to all the waters of the world for quenching our thirst and providing us with strength. Water is life, and we honor its power in every form. With one mind, we send greetings and thanks to the spirit of Water.

## All: Let us give thanks to the waters. Now our minds are one.

Cindy – Pulpit - Reader 4: We are all thankful to the powers of the Four Winds. We hear their voices in the moving air as they refresh us and purify the air we breathe. They help us to bring the change of seasons. With one mind, we give our thanks to the Four Winds.

## All: Let us give thanks to the Four Winds. Now our minds are one.

Leader: We turn our thoughts to the Creator and send greetings and thanks for all the gifts of Creation. Everything we need to live a good life is here. For all the love that is around us, we gather our minds together as one and send the gratitude of our hearts to the Creator.
